Description: The Troop Instructor plays a vital role in ensuring Scouts acquire and refine essential skills needed for advancement and outdoor adventures. The Troop Instructor is responsible for teaching and reinforcing various Scouting skills, such as first aid, camping techniques, orienteering, and knot-tying, through hands-on instruction and demonstrations. As a mentor and educator, the Instructor works closely with younger Scouts and the Troop Guide, helping Scouts meet rank requirements while fostering confidence and independence. This position is instrumental in maintaining the troop's knowledge base and ensuring that every Scout is equipped to succeed, both in the outdoors and within the troop structure.

Responsibilities:

- organize and conduct hands-on training sessions to reinforce skills/knowledge
- work one-on-one or in small groups with Scouts to prepare rank advancement
- serve as a member of the <u>Patrol Leaders' Council (PLC)</u>
- set a good example by <u>wearing the full Scout uniform</u>, living by the Scout Oath and Law, and showing Scout spirit
